About the college

Government Degree College, Pulwama is among the well-established colleges in the UT of J&K. This college, being a co-educational institution, has a total enrolment of more than 3000 students. It was established in the year 1986, with a few subjects of arts stream. Science subjects were introduced during the academic session 2002-03 and Computer Science was incorporated in the curricular network of the institution in 2006, followed by Commerce Stream in 2010.

The college is located on Pulwama–Newa Road at a distance of 1.5 km from the main town with District Court Complex, District Sports Stadium and District Horticulture Office in the vicinity. The college is presently spread over an area of 66 kanals of land.

The college, with a strong infrastructural backup, is known for its excellence in academic and co-curricular activities. In addition to the highly qualified human resource, the college houses capacious and well-equipped laboratories in Science Blocks for all Science subjects to acquaint the students with latest instrumentation and scientific developments. The college houses 32 classrooms including 16 Smart Classrooms and an impressive library housing around 32000 books on varied subjects with an active subscription to twenty national magazines. Moreover, the college offers facilities like EDUSAT, IT Support, UGC Network Resource Centre, Multidisciplinary Research Center and eContent Development Center. Career Counselling Cell, Physical Education, Recreation Hall, Dispensary, Canteen, JK Bank ATM, OBC hostel, auditorium and other student support services are also available. The college has a vast playground where various sports activities are carried out throughout the academic session. The college is under 24x7 CCTV surveillance integrated with RFID based Access Control System.

The college stands affiliated to UGC under section 2(F) and 12(B) of 1956 Act vide UGC letter dated: 19–04–2003. It is a matter of pride that the college went through a successful NAAC inspection in the month of March 2022 and was awarded grade 'A' with CGPA 3.12. This reflects the achievements and overall development the college has made over the years. Besides, the college has the potential to grow into an institution of excellence with the collaborated effort of the teachers, students and social communities.

The Department of Biotechnology (DBT) of GoI, after having recognised the 'ambition and potential for excellence' of the college, awarded the college with DBT STAR College status to provide academic and physical infrastructure for achieving excellence in teaching and unique exposure of students to experiential science. Under the scheme, the college is expected to receive a grant of approximately1.8 crore.

SUBJECT GROUPS FOR SELECTION OF MAJOR AND MINOR SUBJECTS:

In order to overcome the inadequacy of infrastructure and human resource in the Higher Education Institutes (HEIs) , to accommodate the Time-table within the College working hours and also to reduce the number of term-end Examination days all the subjects on offer have been categorized in to 6 groups, with the first five groups comprising Major / Minor Subjects and the 6th group comprising only Minor Subjects.

Under this framework every student shall opt for Two Disciplines of his / her choice (One as a Major and One as a Minor) from the same stream based on interest and eligibility, covering different "Subject Groups". These two subjects shall be a common thread from 1st to the last Semester of the Programme for every student.

The Major subject may be chosen from one of the first five groups, while the Minor Subject can be selected from any of the six Groups, except for the group from which the Major has been chosen.

The students choosing Major as well as Minor Subjects from the first five Groups shall have a flexibility of swapping the Major and Minor Subjects in 3rd Semester, subject to availability in the college and eligibility (to be determined by the college concerned). However, if a student selects a Minor Subject from 6th Group, (designated as Minor Group), exercising this option shall not be available.

FEATURES OF FOUR-YEAR UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMS UNDER NEP 2020:

- I. All Bachelor's Degree programmes are full-time regular courses for the specified duration as per National Education Policy (NEP-2020), with Multiple Exit and Entry systems at various stages after even semesters, from the academic session 2022 and onwards.
- II. As per the UGC Guidelines for Multiple Entry and Exit in Academic Programmes offered in Higher Education Institutions, candidates who secure a minimum CGPA of 7.5 in a three-year Bachelor's Degree Programme shall be allowed to continue studies in the fourth year of the undergraduate programme to pursue and complete the Bachelor's Degree with Research/ Honors'. For admission reservation policy shall be implemented as per S.R.O. 127 dated: - 20-04-2020 read with S.R.O. 249 dated: - the 3-07-2021.
- III. Selection of the candidates from the reserved categories shall be made strictly based on of academic merit and validity of respective reserved category certificates as the case may be. No under-process certificate shall be accepted at any cost.
- IV. Candidates shall ensure to obtain the ABC id from the Academic Bank of Credits Portal by registering on the portal making use of their Aadhaar linked mobile numbers and enter the 12-digit ABC id on their online Admission forms in order to avail the mobility options under Academic Bank of Credits.
- V. Each student shall have to opt for Two Disciplines of his / her choice (One as a Major and One as a Minor) from the same stream based on interest and eligibility. The subjects, however, have to be chosen from two different "Subject Groups". Subjects specified in Group VI can be opted for as Minor subjects only.
- VI. In addition to these, every student shall opt for One Multidisciplinary Course from the same list with the condition that the course opted for has to be different from the Major / Minor Courses and different courses have to be chosen in each of the three semesters and shall not be repeated in any semester.
- VII. Besides the above three disciplines each student shall have to opt for One Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) vertical from a pool of such courses in the first three Semesters. A student has to also choose One Ability Enhancement Courses (AECs) in each of the first three Semesters as per the scheme breakup.
- VIII. A student has to also choose One Value Added Courses (VACs) in the first two Semesters and Two Value Added Courses (VACs) in 3rd Semester as per the scheme breakup.
 - IX. Flexibility to move from one disciplinary area of study to another within the duration of study.
 - X. Opportunity for learners to choose the subject/learning area of interest;
- XI. Facilitating multiple entry and exit options: with certificate, diploma/degree depending upon the number of credits secured:
- XII. Flexibility for learners to move from one institution to another to enable them to have a multi and/or interdisciplinary learning;
- XIII. Facilitating switching to alternative modes of learning (face-to-face, on- line learning, and hybrid modes of learning).

SCHEMES OF MAJOR PROGRAMS:

1. UG Degree Programmes with Single Major:

A student has to secure a minimum of 50% credits from the major discipline for the 3-year/4-year UG degree to be awarded a single major. For example, in a 3-year UG programme, if the total number of credits to be earned is 120, a student of Physics with a minimum of 60 credits will be awarded a B.Sc. in Physics with a single major. Similarly, in a 4-year UG programme, if the total number of credits to be earned is 160, a student of Physics with a minimum of 80 credits will be awarded a B.Sc. (Hons./Hon. With Research) in Physics in a 4-year UG programme with single major.

2. UG Degree Programmes with Double Major:

A student has to secure a minimum of 40% credits from the second major discipline for the 3-year/4-year UG degree to be awarded a double major.

For example, in a 3-year UG programme, if the total number of credits to be earned is 120, a student of Physics with a minimum of 48 credits will be awarded a B.Sc. in Physics with a double major. Similarly, in a 4-year UG programme, if the total number of credits to be earned is 160, a student of Physics with a minimum of 64 credits will be awarded a B.Sc. (Hons./Hon. With Research) in Physics in a 4-year UG programme with double major.

3. Interdisciplinary UG Programmes:

The credits for core courses shall be distributed among the constituent disciplines/subjects so as to get core competence in the interdisciplinary programme. For example, a degree in Econometrics requires courses in economics, statistics, and mathematics. The total credits to core courses shall be distributed so that the student gets full competence in Econometrics upon completion of the programme. The degree for such students will be awarded as B.Sc. in Econometrics for a 3-year UG programme or B.Sc. (honors') / B.Sc. (honor's with Research) in Econometrics for a 4-year UG programme.

Discipline

DISCIPLINE

College administration monitors the conduct of the students in the campus. Students have to observe the following rules:

I. It is mandatory for every student to maintain proper discipline in the college campus. Any kind of act by the student that amounts to indiscipline will make him/her liable to imposition of heavy fine or even expulsion from the college.

Students must carry the Identity Card with them on all working days and should produce the same as and when asked for.

- II. Smoking inside the college campus is strictly prohibited.
- III. Pursuant to the directive from the Honorable Supreme Court and endorsed by the Honorable High Court of J&K, the UGC and the Higher Education Department J&K, ragging in the educational institutions has been banned under law and, therefore, any student found involved in ragging in the College will be dealt with under rules which can include even expulsion from the institution.
- IV. A student shall be allowed to appear in the examination only if he/ she has obtained at least 75% attendance in all the subjects.
- V. Pursuant to the directive from the UGC, the sale and consumption of junk food is prohibited in the college campus.

UNIFORM

Students must come to the college in proper uniform. The College administration has set the following uniform for boys and girls studying in the college:

Boys: White Full Sleeves Shirt and Black Formal Pants, Black sweater (whenever needed)

Girls: Light Brown Frock (Light Chocolate Colour) and/or Abaya, White Shalwar and White Chunni, Black sweater (whenever needed).

IDENTITY CARD

Once enrolled, the students will be provided with identity cards which they will have to carry with them at all times. In case of loss, the duplicate I-card may be issued to the student against a cash payment of Rs.100 and an affidavit duly attested by 1st class magistrate stating the reasons and circumstance which led to the loss.

Student Studient facilities

LIBRARY

The library functions as an important resource centre, fulfilling the academic needs of students, faculty and other staff members. All the housekeeping activities are performed in an automated environment using SOUL 2.0. The library is equipped with modern gadgets of information technology and latest methods/techniques are used for information processing, retrieval and dissemination.

The library houses around 32000 in the form of textbooks and reference books.

E-resources: The library subscribes to N-LIST database of INFLIBNET through which online access is provided to hundreds of reputed journals and thousands of E-books. The library members need to register for online access to the database.

Regulations for access:

a. Membership: All bona fide students, faculty and other staff members of the college are eligible for membership.

b. Loan Period:

Student: 1 book for 14 days Faculty: 5 books for 30 days Official: 3 books for 20 days



c. Overdue Charges:

- · For the period of 10 days from the due date of return: INR 1 per day per book.
- For the period beyond 10 days from the due date of return: INR 2 per day per book.
- d. Fine for the Lost Material:
- In case of books published in India: 5 times the price of the original book.
- Foreign Publication: Price of the original book as per present rates plus 20% of the price. The library accepts replacement of the actual book(s) as well.
- e. Restrictions: Reference books, magazines/journals, newspapers and other reading materials, exclusively to be used in the library, are not allowed to be carried beyond the premises of the library.

Facilities/ Services

- a. Reading room: A well established and centrally heated reading room has been designated within the library having a seating capacity of 150 users.
- b. Career Corner: It houses material for the students interested in preparing for various competitive tests like IAS, KAS, GATE, NET, SET, PG entrance tests, etc.
- c. Newspaper section: The library has subscribed to various reputed magazines and newspapers, both local and national.
- d. Reprography: Reprography/ xerox facility is available for the users at nominal charges.
- e. Browsing Centre: A well-established browsing center having sufficient number of computers to browse through the internet is available.
- f. Reference Section: The reference section houses encyclopedias, dictionaries, directories, hand-books, Atlas maps etc.
- g. Book Bank: The college library offers book-bank scheme for OBC/ ST/SC and specially-abled students. Under the scheme, students can borrow four (04) books for the whole semester which need to be returned before the end of the semester.

Library users are advised to adhere strictly to the following instructions:

- I. Smoking, noise, chatting etc. are prohibited in the library.
- II. Mobile phones should be switched off or put on silent mode within the library premises.
- III. Personal/ private books and bags are not allowed inside the library, these are to be deposited at the property counter.
- IV. Cash, jewellery and other costly things should **not** be deposited at the property counter.
- V. The library shall not be responsible for any loss or damage to the personal belongings left at the property counter.
- VI. Tearing off, marking and mutilation of pages of books is strictly prohibited and can invite penalization.
- VII. The activities inside the library are monitored through CCTVs.

CAREER COUNSELLING

CELL

The college has a dynamic Career Counselling-cum-Guidance cell for the students desirous to know about the various skill courses of their choice and to pursue higher studies under different career options. The career counseling cell also conducts special placement / recruitment drives for students in collaboration with reputed national & multi-national companies. Under recruitment agencies like National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC), HIMAYAT, various placement programmes have already been conducted successfully during previous academic sessions. Similarly, ROOMAN Technologies and Alpine Group of Institutions also conducted awareness programmes in the previous sessions.

The career counseling cell also assists the PMUSP Cell (formerly PMSSS) in the verification and uploading of application forms. The aim of the scheme is to provide exposure to the J&K youth by providing access to various top ranking colleges across India. Fortunate enough, our college was selected as facilitation centre for the students. Our College is fully equipped with all the facilities for verification and uploading of application forms of desirous candidates for AICTE programmes. Our College through this centre also provides facilities like redressal of grievances of those students who approach us from time to time to clear their doubts. In the past, application forms of more than 1000 candidates were verified and uploaded on AICTE web portal and many grievances of applicants were satisfactorily addressed.

CANTEEN

The college canteen provides a variety of affordable/ subsidised food and drink options (except junk food) thereby taking into consideration health and dietary requirements of the consumers. The performance of the canteen is monitored by the College Canteen Committee.



PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND SPORTS

The department of Physical Education and Sports is headed by an adept Physical Training Instructor Mr Mudasir Ahmad Dar (MPEd, MPhil, SET qualified) under whose supervision numerous outdoor and indoor physical activities are carried out. The department organizes interclass tournaments for both boys and girls in different indoor and outdoor games throughout the year. Moreover, the department participates in various college events organised by University of Kashmir and other institutions from time to time.

FACILITIES

- I. A playground wherein all major and minor outdoor games are played II. A Table Tennis Hall for boys wherein TT and other indoor games like chess and carrom are played.
- III. A girls common room where girl students play various indoor games like TT, Carrom, Chess etc.
- IV. A well-equipped Health and Fitness centre where in desirous students spend a good time to maintain their physique.





SCHOLARSHIPS/FINANCIAL AID (INTERNAL)

The college provides financial aid to the regular students with economically challenged status and those who belong to other specified categories. After inviting applications on prescribed format from the deserving students, the applications are thoroughly scrutinized by the "Financial Aid Committee" followed by preliminary verification and interview.



SCHOLARSHIPS (EXTERNAL)

In order to enhance Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) in J&K UT, the government, from time to time, comes up with various scholarship schemes for economically backward, educationally backward and students belonging to minority community etc. Every year, College Scholarship Cell forwards nearly 2000 to 3000 applications to various agencies for different scholarships.
